Courtney Lloyd Taylor was born in Georgetown, British Guiana, now Guyana, South America, On February 8, 1937. During his earlier years he was very active helping his father around the family farm while attending St. Stevens School. He married the late Joycelyn Yvonne Gouveia In February of 1960. She was the love of his life. Together they had four children: Courtney Jr. Brian, Janice and Mark, all of whom he loved dearly. In 1969 he and his family came to the United States which allowed Joyce, his wife, to pursue further nursing studies and for Courtney to continue his entrepreneurial spirit.

He worked at Columbia University Teacher's College for many years before leaving to work on a ship as a chef. Upon his return to land, he opened a laundromat while otherwise working towards his goal of owning a restaurant. He did become a chef, and with his wife's encouragement he ventured out to start several of his own businesses. His specialty was Guyanese - West Indian dishes; his Black Pudding, Cookup rice and Black Cake, were legendary.

Courtney loved life and wanted to enjoy his senior years in a sunny environment. In February of 2008 he made the decision to relocate from New York to warm Orlando Florida, where until his death he enjoyed a life of leisure and the loving care provided by his son Brian and daughter Janice.

Courtney was the fifth child of the late Stella Isador Small and James Emmanuel Taylor's ten children. He had six brothers; Claude, Walter, Winston, Edgar, Alwyn and Maxie, three sisters; Elsie, Waveney and Huldah Patricia. He was preceded in death by three of his siblings; Claude, Elsie and Huldah Patricia(Patsy). He is survived by all of his children Courtney Jr., Brian, Janice, Mark, thirteen grandchildren, four great grandchildren, daughters-in law, son-in-law, five brothers, one sister, many nieces and nephews, brothers-in-law, sisters-in law and a host of relatives and close friends.
