Education and Achievements: A lifelong scholar, Alexander was the valedictorian of Jones High School Class of 1962. He went on to graduate with honors, earning multiple MBAs from Golden Gate University, San Francisco, CA, Columbia School of Broadcasting, San Francisco, and the University of Central Florida, Orlando. He was also an FAA Certified pilot. His creative side flourished as a hobbyist, collecting coins, stamps, and seashells. He was known for his secret recipes developed in his passionate craft brewery.

Military Service: Chief Petty Officer Godwin dedicated a significant part of his
