Matt Drees and Dan Davies lived in the Bent Pine apartments and Annie Ford was their closest neighbor just across the hall. They would say hi the hall sometimes and occasionally help her change a light bulb or other small tasks she needed help with around her apartment. Matt started hosting the young adult small group that many of us attended. One Christmas we took a plate of cookies to many of his neighbors. Annie just about closed the door in our face and accused us of trying to kill her since she had diabetes. She warmed up when she heard who we were and that we were meeting there for Bible study. She loved Jesus, but had a hard time getting around and so had not been attending church. She became a regular attender at our small group time and we loved her crazy sense of humor and her fun Puerto-Rica/New Yorker accent. She would tell us funny stories of fighting the cranky guy at walmart for the motorized carts, and would also always have something to share about how God had blessed her or provided for her that week. She would always tell us it was important to share how God is working in your life and to pass along the blessings. She also loved parties and made sure we went out to dinner for anyone's birthday.

Josh and Ashley Foltz moved into the same complex in 2010 I think. Matt and I got married in 2011 and we lived in his apartment for a month before moving down to the Lake Nona area. I remember the time Matt took me over and told Annie that we were engaged and she graciously gave her approval. While we were nearby, she was able to call us when she need to go to the ER, and Ashley was also able to help take her to some doctor appointments when her car wasn't working well. We enjoyed hanging out or going out to dinner with her at various times. She was always up for doing something fun. One time Matt and I were with her at her favorite Italian place getting pizza. At the beginning of the meal, Matt asked "Can I pray for the meal now?" Annie looked up sharply, "No you can't pay for

the meal, and I won't hear any more about it!!" It took a few minute of her protesting louding before we convinced her Matt just wanted to ask grace for the food. It because a running joke for our meals out after that.

Around this time Annie begun attending CrossPointe and got to know Dolly and Nancy and some of the others. Later, she also moved down to the Lake Nona area to be near the church and friends. A bunch of us got together and helped her move. Her new apartment was a good fit for her and she eventually started hosting the small group. She was very generous to us all over the years. She loved to give and to share and to bless others. She would often provide dinner for the group or at least some sort of snacks.
