Oviedo, FL – Barbara Ann Robinson, age 79, went to be with the Lord on July 1, 2021 at the Oviedo Medical Center. She had been in failing health for more than a year. Barbara was born to Charles Paul and Margaret Mary Nagy (late of Brookhaven, PA.) in Philadelphia, PA on March 14, 1942. She graduated from the Academy of Notre Dame high school in Glen Riddle, PA in 1960, where she formed life-long close and dear friendships with some of her fellow classmates that have lasted up to her recent passing. Barbara made a career as a Customs Broker in the Import/Export business, and she successfully managed the Morris-Friedman Company airport office in Philadelphia for the Liberati family for more than 25 years before moving to Florida to marry her

husband George in February 1989. Barbara began working for the City of Oviedo, where she quickly learned the charm and beauty of her new town. As the kids grew up and moved away, Barbara began filling the home with many pets. Starting off with one cat, Witchy, led to her rescuing two dogs, Fred & Ginger, followed by adopting Ray, Blarney and Mingo. These six pets lived the good life! They were loved, spoiled, and enjoyed many sunny days in the pool followed by kisses and cuddles when going to bed.

Barbara loved the simple joys of life, like listening to the birds outside her window as she drank her cup of tea. She enjoyed eating out, and celebrated many occasions at her favorite restaurants and pubs. It became tradition to have breakfast at the Town House when company came to town and the Oviedo Ale House or Froggers when her Philadelphia Eagles were not playing on her local stations. Barbara was an avid reader and read well over 100 books a year on average. She had a wide and varied taste for her reading, but her passion was for true crime thrillers. She prided herself on being an expert on the British Royal Family and kept herself up to date on the family's current affairs and controversies while setting traditions such as waking up in the early morning hours for any royal wedding. Barbara enjoyed traveling where her adventures took her to Niagara Falls, Atlantic City, Las Vegas, Seattle, Biloxi, Irving, Louisville, to name a few along with many drives along the I-95 corridor where she enjoyed the beauty of the fall scenery. In her later years, Barbara discovered a passion for cruises! She loved going on cruises and found the tropical waters and laid-back atmosphere of the East and West Caribbean Islands both relaxing and rejuvenating. She lived only 45 minutes from the Cape Canaveral cruise terminal, so her bags were always packed to go at a moment's notice! Whether she was raising children, caring for others, working, traveling, or day to day life, Barbara cherished every moment and memory made with those she loved. She taught us all many valuable lessons, not just by her actions & words but also by her faith and her belief in the power of prayer. Even the hours leading up to the LORD calling her home, Barbara

shared with her family what mattered most: Being Kind, Staying Connected, and Walking With The Lord.

As people journey through life, they leave a legacy behind. A legacy of kindness and love, courage and compassion, humor and inspiration, joy and most importantly faith. This was Barbara. Although she is no longer with us, Barbara's legacy and love will never be forgotten.

“ Barbara and I met in the First grade at St. Gabriel's school in Norwood.

In 1952, by chance, both of our families relocated to a new housing development in Brookhaven, Pa at the same time. From then on Barbara and I attended school together until we graduated from Notre Dame High School in 1960. Barbara was like my second sister.

Our homes were within walking distance so we frequently spent free time together. Jump rope, roller skating, biking, and paper dolls, original plays staged in the backyard with blankets on the clothesline for curtains., all filled our summer days. The list is endless and so are the memories.

At high school graduation, Barb gave me a homemade graduation card. Two stick people on the front of the card (actually a sheet of white school paper)with the lines:" We ain't got a barrel of money, maybe we're ragged and funny, but we travel along singing our song, side by side." Congratulations, Pat! Barbara was an original!

She loved humor, she always saw the glass as half full. She was also headstrong as her Dad used to say. She definitely had opinions but that is what made her interesting and fun. Barbara had a voracious appetite for reading and taking the bus to the only public library in Chester was a treat for us.

Barb had a love of people, which is probably why she loved history so much. She treated everyone with the same kindness, respect, caring and love. She had a prayer list of friends and those who needed extra prayer for an illness or special need. She faithfully remembered them each night and was always happy to hear if the prayer was answered. Many times , an email would come with a "thinking of you" or " how are you doing"? Staying connected to friends and family was important.

As time went by and our lives moved in different directions, we didn't see each other as frequently. However Barb would always

stop and see my Mom when she was in the neighborhood. My Mom loved her visits. Barb would have a kind of energy that you felt better when you saw her and she was always interested in what you had to say.

Occasionally, our group of high school friends would get together for dinner. Cathy's photos on the memory page shows our group at some of these occasions.

After Barb went to Florida, we always planned a dinner when she was home for a visit.

Finally when traveling became too difficult for Barbara, phone calls and emails became our connection. Without fail, birthday calls were never forgotten and were on average 2+ hours. Our calls were like a continuation of a conversation that began a long time ago

Conversations would always include her family and grandchildren and how much she depended on George. She was so grateful for their love and support. I was so blessed to have had Barbara as a treasured friend for over 70 years. I miss her very much but I have so many memories to keep me company.

My deepest sympathy to George and the family. Barbara walked with the Lord and how He has taken her home.
