Five siblings; Sharon Jones (Darnell), Lennell, Darnell (Alfrieda), John, & Marvin (Linda)

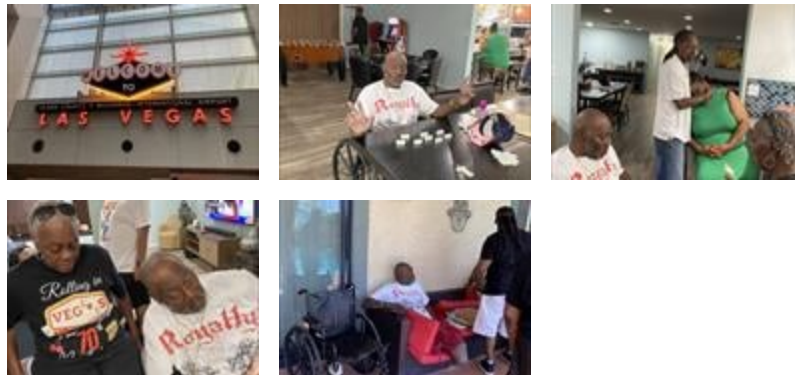
