Carl M. Olivieri

Known for his sense of humor and devotion to his dear wife Patty, Carl Michael Olivieri passed away on Monday evening, January 16th, 2017, surrounded by loving family at the Florida Hospital Orlando. He was 79.

Born on July 8th, 1937, Carl was the youngest child of Camillo and Pasqua (Travaglini) Olivieri.

Carl enlisted in the Navy in 1955. He progressed through enlisted and warrant officer grades and retired at the rank of Lt. Commander in 1978, receiving numerous commendations and awards throughout his naval career. His sons considered him a genius with electronics technology and automobile repair.

Upon retirement from the Navy, Carl and family moved to Sidney Ohio where they've resided since 1978. He worked for The Monarch Machine Tool Company as the Manager of Field Services and later for the Makino-Leblond Machine Tool Company. Not wanting to be idle, he started Olivieri and Sons Industrial Services (OASIS) and consulted for a variety of manufacturers and machine builders.

After his final retirement, Carl and Patty became part time residents of Sidney and spent more time living in Ft. Lauderdale Florida, eventually settling in

Orlando.

Survivors include his wife of 60 years, Patricia K. Moore whom he married on March 14th, 1956; children Anthony (Carolyn) Olivieri of Sidney, Jay Olivieri of Sidney, Tim Olivieri of Springfield, Michael (Jayne) Olivieri of Sidney and Nicholas (Eddie) Olivieri of Orlando, 11 grandchildren and 19 great-grandchildren.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a sister Catherine Nezrick; brothers Anthony Olivieri, Jim Olivieri and Mike Olivieri.

A Celebration of Life is being planned for a later date in Ohio.
