Clayton (Gene) Eugene St. John 92, died Friday, April 29, 2016 at home in Belle Isle, Florida. He was the son of Burt and Thelma Maude St. John. He was cremated and his remains will be placed in the North Vernon Cemetery, North Vernon, Indiana.
