“What a LIFE! It's been two weeks since Dana went to be with Father God, and I still expect her to call. She would call me 3 or 4 times a week, and I'm still not used to the calls being gone....



I met Dana and her mother about two decades ago, and became aware of her physical problems, but they never hindered her zest for life. She never complained; she just moved forward at full speed! In my opinion, she crammed about 80 years of living into 47 years of LIFE.

Dana and I both have a "weird sense of humor." We would often "shock" each other by sprinkling our conversations with off-handed comments. It was all clean and wholesome, but "unexpected." Her laughter would erupt unrestrained; I would have to hold the phone away from my ear. I remember one of her calls that very week. She was telling me that her study of the Catechism was about completed, and she would be tested soon. I told her that she need not worry. As many Cats as she has had, she would "ace" that Cat test with flying colors. The laughter that followed was loud and long. "A merry heart doeth good like a medicine."

Dana had her value system in good order. It looked something like this:

1. God & Jesus. Her pursuit of Holiness in her life occupied 1st place, and spanned the study of several religions. These were not shallow studies. She was deep and sincere, and her conclusions were satisfying to her.
2. She pursued health. She searched the internet and assembled considerable knowledge about her conditions, nutrition, and natural health tips. It contributed to her mobility and length of life. She even authored books!
3. She valued "Rightness." Woe to the person who lied, cheated, or took advantage of others. If Dana was aware of it, passion would light up and she would PREACH! If a person wanted to befriend Dana, they had better behave!
4. Dana was focused and thorough. When she tackled a subject, it was attacked with intensity. "Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do

*it with all thy might." Her work ethic came right from the Bible.
5. She was an intercessor and prayer warrior. Every day. Only in
Eternity will we learn how many people's lives she changed with her
prayers. Her prayers were specific and intense also - no "pansy"
prayers from her! I know God was always listening for Dana.*

*Dana "adopted" me; she called me "Dad." I took her shopping for
furniture, fixed things at her apartment, and had talks with her about
God, health, and "other stuff." Whatever came into her apartment
(furniture, computer, cat, book) she wanted me to come over and
bless it. I think everything she had ended up being blessed.*

*A couple of years after she first came to my office, she noticed that
our complimentary candy dish was nearly empty. She decided to fix
that. Ever after, she made it her job to replenish my candy dish her
own self...for years. But the REAL candy she supplied was the
sweet joy and encouragement she gave every time I was with her.*

It has been two weeks, but...I still expect her to call.....

It never mattered what I was wearing, how I was wearing it, what color my hair was or how I wore it. She was, however, always quick to point out when I had garlic breath. She'd say, "Whew sister you smell like garlic". I would retort with my usual comment about keeping the vampires away. And she always gave me her happy chuckle.

This life was a tough struggle for Dana. But she usually kept her sense of humor and believed there was a greater purpose.

I admire and appreciate that - especially now. I will miss her - her sense of humor, her prayers, her Sunday night calls.

I never really got to say goodbye.

I'm thankful she's at rest now and have hope it will be better on the

other side.
