



## Daniel Anthony Nardolilli

February 18, 1929 - April 25, 2021

NARDOLILLI, DANIEL, 92, of Orlando died April 25, 2021. Mr. Nardolilli served in the U.S. Navy from October 1947 through January 1952 at the rank of HM2. He retired as a Patrolman with the Jersey City, NJ Police Department after 26 years of service. He moved to Orlando in 1980 with his wife Edith who passed in 2010. Mr. Nardolilli had a second career as a Security Officer serving for 20 years at Isleworth Country Club in Windermere. He was Catholic, and a member of Holy Cross Catholic Church. Survivors are his son Michael (Pam), of Arlington VA; daughters Donna Brown of Orlando and Nancy Wicklin (Rick), of Cary, NC and seven grandchildren.
