It's so hard to believe you are not here with us today but I know that you are in a better place. I love you and miss you so much!

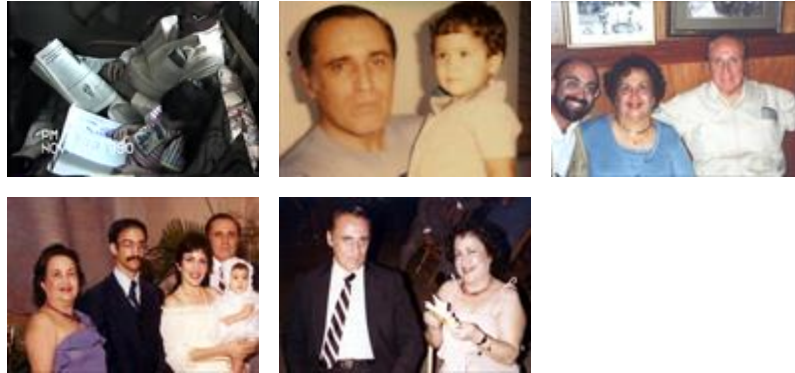
