On June 14, 2022, we lost our dear father, Felix, who passed away peacefully in his sleep. He was 92 years old.

Felix was born on February 18, 1930 in Trinidad & Tobago, where he was raised, and met and married his wife, Ailsa. He was a loving father of 4 children, Derek, Lisa, Paul, and Lesley. He was a devout Catholic who served in the Society of St Vincent de Paul and the Emmanuel Community.

Felix was an avid sportsman who played soccer for his alma mater, St Mary's College, and also played cricket for Queen's Park Cricket Club. He also loved playing cards and was a member of his bridge club.

Felix worked at Shell, Texaco, and finally National Petroleum for many years until retirement. In 2015 he moved to Orlando, Florida, and lived with his youngest daughter, Lesley, until his death.

We shared a great love for sports, especially cricket, football, boxing and in his later years armchair golf and tennis. We had our differences and a few dust ups but in the end he was my beloved Daddy and I will always remember him in a positive light.

He spent his life working in the downstream (marketing) end of the oil and gas business from which he retired after 40 years of service. Many benefitted from his management of LPG distribution throughout Trinidad and Tobago.

In 1967, our mother Ailsa visited her siblings in Montreal and fell seriously ill. He had to immediately fly to Canada to be with her and accompany her back home. My Aunt Vilma told me many times that "When Felix came down the airplane stairs, as soon as your mother saw him, she immediately got better." He was beloved by all the Fitzwilliams.
