Frederick "Fred" Randall, 79, of Orlando, FL passed away on May 29, 2021. He was born on April 14, 1942, to Charles and Katherine Kalinuk Randall in Lynn, Massachusetts.

He graduated from Danvers High School in 1960 and was a member of the band as a percussionist and the varsity ice hockey team all four years. After high school, he went on to earn a teaching degree at Salem State College in 1964. In 1962 he played on the inaugural varsity Salem State hockey team and for many years he was a fraternity brother in the Salem State Beta chapter of Kappa Delta Phi. He was also involved with KDPhi Alumni Association for many years.

After graduation, he became a police officer with the Danvers Police Department and eventually joined New England Life as a career life agent for 26 years. He also worked part-time for the West Boxford, MA Police Department for a few years. While with NE Life, he received many awards for

outstanding excellence as an agent and went on to earn his CLU (Certified Life Underwriter's designation). He developed a busy tax practice for many years and became a Credentialed Enrolled Agent (E.A.) with the IRS.

His hobbies included race car driving and he spent many Saturday nights at Star Speedway in Epping, NH running the "K9" in the mid-70's.

Fred is survived by his wife of 39 years, Eileen of Orlando, FL; son Wayne Frederick (Monique) of Lake Mary, FL; sister Carol Moreland of Eliot, ME; stepson Francis "Frank" (Marion) of Orlando, FL; Stepdaughter Doreen (Scott) of Amesbury, MA; and foster-son Michael of Salem, NH. Grandchildren include David, Lyndsey, Hunter, Orrin, Aidan, and Charlee.

One of his greatest passions was rescuing and finding homes for feral cats. Over the years, he and Eileen created a loving home for many cats. Tucker, Brandi, Patience, Sister-Mary, Sam, and Skitty are still members of their family.

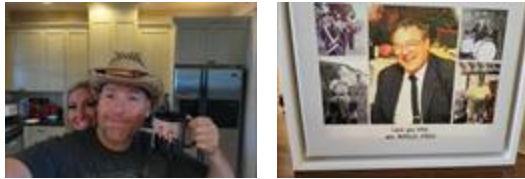


