Yo, Debra Crozier, conocí a Gabino hace 27 años en Winter Garden, Florida. Me encantaba su pelo largo que le llegaba a la cadera. Gabino estaba recogiendo naranjas y en mi día libre de Denny's trabajábamos codo con codo. Recuerdo la vez que me lavé las manos con el agua y me dijo "¡eso es para beber! - ¡Ja ja!. Luego Gabino trabajó en paisajismo y consiguió un trabajo por más de 8 años en Greenleaf, le encantaba trabajar ahí. Incluso plantó mandarinas, flores, arbustos en nuestro jardín, si no tenía una

bordeadora, recortaba los bordes con un machete. Tengo 3 hijos para quienes Gabino era como un padre: Melissa, Frank y Stevie. También tengo 15 nietos y todos admiraban a Gabino. Cada uno de ellos lo amaba, ya que siempre les mostró a cada uno que se preocupaba por ellos. – José, Ricardo, Marielissa, Elissaruby, Yarintzy, Marintzy, Julliany, Israel Jr., Victoria, Esteban, Chassidy, Cornelius Jr., Cornell, Chanell y Cortavious. Gabino llevaba a Cornell -el de 12 años- a buscar metal y íbamos a chatarrero y él compraba cerveza natural light y le daba el resto 10 -15 dólares, a veces más, a Cornell. ¡Siempre dijo que Cornell no tiene miedo de trabajar, puede levantar cualquier cosa!

También teníamos un bisnieto, Alexander, a quien le encantaba estar con Gabino en todo momento cuando nos visitaba el fin de semana. Gabino siempre lo cargaba y Gabino le permitía ponerle pasta de dientes en las piernas y creo que le ponía gelatina o caramelos en el pelo. Gabino siempre lo llamaba "Baby". Gabino siempre decía que no sabía por qué ama tanto a Alexander y por qué Alexander lo ama a él. – Dije que Alexander acude a él más que a nadie. Todas las noches llevábamos de paseo a Alexander. Alexander también tiene otros hermanos: Angie, Alexis, Ezequiel (Ricky) y Miguel.

Gabino también disfrutó de las comidas al aire libre en nuestra casa con nuestro nieto Ricardo y Manuella, o ir a la casa de mi hermana Carol y Jorge o la casa de mi hija Melissa e Israel: ¡Buenos tiempos en familia! – Siempre le decía Gabino a su nieto José, ¡parece un abogado cuando va a trabajar! Y siempre le decía a su nieto Ricardo, él siempre trabaja duro en el calor y nunca se queja.

A Gabino siempre le gustaba hablar con sus hermanos Héctor e Inez, así como con sus primos Flavio Hernández, Alicia Maciel y su esposo; Rhonda y su esposo; María Hernández, Enriqueta Hernández. También tenía un buen amigo que conocí cuando trabajaba en Greenleaf, Isael.

Me encantaron sus tatuajes. Siempre decía “soy 100% mexicano” y señalaba su tatuaje. Le encantaba el tatuaje de la virgen María. La estrella fue el último

tatuaje. También tenía el nombre de su padre en sus dedos y una "A" debajo del tatuaje de la virgen María, que representaba al bisnieto Alexander.

Voy a extrañar hablar en el porche delantero o conducir. Siempre lo amaré y lo extrañaré, ¡MUCHO!

Frank and Stevie. I also have 15 grandchildren, and they all looked up to Gabino. They each loved him since he showed each of them that he cared for them. – Jose, Ricardo, Marielissa, Elissaruby, Yarintzy, Marintzy, Julliany, Israel Jr., Victoria, Esteban, Chassidy, Cornelius Jr., Cornell, Chanell and Cortavious. Gabino took Cornell – the 12-year-old – to look for metal and we would drive to the scrap and he would buy natural light beer and give the rest 10 -15 dollars, sometimes more, to Cornell. He always said Cornell is not afraid to work he can lift Anything!!

We also had a great grandson – Alexander – Who loved being with Gabino every moment when he was over for the weekend. Gabino always carried him around and would allow him to put tooth paste on his legs and I think he put slime or candy on his hair too. Gabino always called him “Baby”. Gabino would always say he don’t know why he loves Alexander so much and why Alexander loves him. – I said Alexander goes to him more than anyone. Every night, we always gave Alexander a ride. Alexander also has other siblings: Angie, Alexis, Ezequiel (Ricky), and Miguel.

Gabino also enjoyed cookouts at our house with our grandson Ricardo and Manuella, or going to my sister house Carol and Jorge or daughter’s house Melissa and Israel – nice family time! – Gabino always told his grandson Jose, he looks like a lawyer when he goes to work!
