Growing up, George was a dedicated student and would work long hours in his parents' grocery store. Naturally athletic, he participated in several sports and was a three-sport letterman. Living in Detroit, he attended many Detroit Tiger baseball games. Being an exceptional baseball player himself, he was invited to try out for the Tigers as a player. Feeling he did not love baseball enough to make it his career, he decided to enroll in college instead.

George would attend the University of Detroit where he majored in electrical engineering. Before graduating, he served in the Air Force and was stationed in Japan during the Korean War.

After the war, it was love at first sight when George met Genevieve. They were married six months later and moved to Huntsville, Alabama where George accepted an engineering job with the Raytheon Corporation.

A year later, still working for Raytheon, they decided to move to Northborough, Massachusetts. This is where they would raise their three children.

While working full-time at Raytheon, George managed to earn a business degree from Northeastern University in 1966, and a law degree from the New England School of Law in 1972. George was a dedicated family man who always put his family first. He was always an avid supporter and attendee of his three children's sporting and extracurricular activities and events.

As an engineer, he wrote many manuals for companies like Raytheon and designed manufacturing facilities and warehouses for Digital Equipment Corporation domestically and overseas. He performed various other
