George A. Nugent, 74, of Lake Placid, NY, passed away peacefully on July 13, 2014 in Orlando, Florida

Born in Lake Placid, NY to George & Emily Nugent, he moved to Texas after graduating Lake Placid H.S. to attend the Univ. of Texas for his BBA. He received full academic scholarship from the US Navy & ROTC.

He married Pauline Andrews in 1966-1976. He eventually became a lieutenant in the Navy and was on the USS Fletcher DD-445 in Vietnam and other tours of duty.

He returned to Univ. of Texas to receive his Masters in Business Admin 68'. He worked at The Pentagon as an aide to the Secretary of the Navy for a short time. He then worked for General Electric Co. 1968-1970 in contract negotiations for the Navy.

He changed locations & careers and went into recruitment and placement with Fox Morris Assoc. in Towson, Maryland & McLean, Va. 1973-1994. In 1994-2004 he was with CPSI, Inc. of Baltimore as a technical recruitment & placement consultation. He lived in Timonium, MD. until he retired & moved back to Austin, Texas in 2005. In 2010 he moved to Orlando, Florida to be near his only child & daughter, Kristen Nugent.

He was an extremely intelligent man & a very good loving Father. He will be missed very much. He is survived by his daughter Kristen, several Nieces & one Nephew as well as many friends & people that cared about him.

He will be joined again with all his brothers & sister, Mother & Father in heaven once again. He will be laid to rest at St. Agnes Church in Lake Placid, NY.

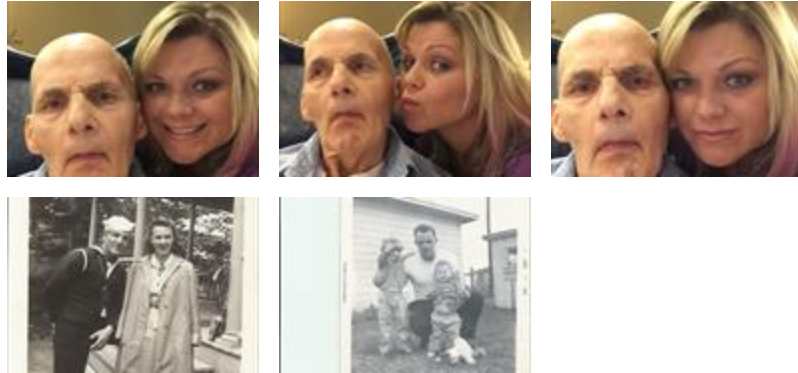
