After getting to know him, he wanted to know how to make money in the hotel. I had one word for him, "Banquets" I told him to work hard and set a good example and you can transfer to coconuts pool bar and work with me outside serving guests. A few months later Goran was serving Daiquiri poolside. He always had a great ability to connect with strangers. G and I never really hung out too much outside of work, maybe just a few times. He used to ask me for the TV remote at the pool bar to turn on an extreme sports channel and we would just eat the bar nuts and talk about life. The drive he had for being successful was obvious. He always had questions for me about life and how to be successful. Not that I am, but together we would think of what was next for us. After he left the hotel and came back as a banquet server I used to see a big smile all the time on his face. He had done it, a bus boy making minimum wage was now making 25 to 50 dollars an hour. I don't work for the Hyatt anymore and unfortunately hadn't seen G since I left a few months ago. He was a great friend and person. The kind of guy that would take the shirt off his back for a stranger. I knew that just from shaking hands with him. Can't put into words how sorry I am for his family. May God look over all of you. I'm deeply sorry for your loss. Amen.
