Harley Ronald Fisher, 69, of Orlando, Florida, passed away peacefully in his sleep on Thursday, May 25, 2017. His brother, Edward Stuart of West Virginia, passed the following day. Ron was born in North Carolina on November 4, 1947 to Harley and Isabell Fisher. He graduated high school at the age of 16 and enlisted in the US Army the same year, just weeks after his 17th birthday, serving his country honorably in the Vietnam War. Ron had a natural aptitude for building and programming computers, which he did throughout life, eventually opening several businesses. He loved astronomy, Star Trek, and sports cars. He is survived by his daughter, Veronica Pear, and her husband, Jared Keller, both of Sacramento, California. His final place of rest will be with his comrades in arms at Cape Canaveral National Cemetery, 5525 US HWY1, Mims, Florida.
