An extraordinary man has gone to heaven on May 10, 2018 peacefully in his home with his family by his side. James William Riney Sr., 88, of Orlando, FL was born one of 10 children to the late Guerdon and Mabel Riney on April 17, 1930 in Owensboro, KY. He was of Irish descent and very proud of his heritage. He graduated from St. Mary's College High School Dept, then Brescia College in 1953, joined the U.S. Army with honorable discharge in 1955. He sold life insurance in Owensboro and then completed his master of education degree in 1964 from Spalding University in Louisville, KY. He was a high school Latin and English teacher, guidance counselor and assistant principal from 1959 to 1967. He moved to Fort Pierce in 1968 working for the school board. In 1972, he moved to Orlando to work as an Education Consultant for the Florida Department of Education and was a real estate salesperson. He received the Migrant Education Lifetime Achievement award in 2007. After he retired, he continued to provide advocacy services to students and their families. He was an active member of St. John Vianney Catholic Church serving as an usher, choir member and Eucharist Minister. He enjoyed golf, swimming and spending valuable time with his family. He served on the church parish council and school board also served on the Diocesan School Board, was Past Grand Knight of the St. Joseph Council #5958 and Past Faithful Navigator of 4th Degree Monsignor Bishop Assembly #0162.

He is survived by his wife of 44 years, Sarah Cornell Riney; daughters Katie (Tim) Kilkelly of Tampa, FL, Jamie (John) Gutweniger of Orlando; son James Riney Jr. (Nicole) of Orlando; 8 grandchildren Johnny, CJ, Ryan, Sarah, Aimee, Lily, Allyson and William; sister Beverly Cambron and brother Don Riney (Dee).
