After 32 years, James was instrumental in locating and introducing his niece, Yvonne Terrell to our family in Ohio, Orlando and St. Louis. James was also the historian of the family. Often he would recall significant family events with clarity and share them with the rest of the family. This was invaluable. Having no children of his own, James had a caring spot in his heart for small children. He would, on a regular basis hand out \$1 bills to little

girls and boys just to see a little smile on their face. When asked why and he said “they are all my children”.

James was always there to provide support and help to others. Whether its comforting family members or helping celebrate a new success, James was always there showing his support. His family was his most valuable possession.
