He loved being next to the ocean, and in his younger years, that love included snorkeling, diving, and boating.

Skip is survived by his wife and companion of 26 years, Nicole, and daughters Deidre Anne (Bill), Karen Marie, and Jennifer Lynn. He is also survived by his sisters Eileen and Joan and his brother Eugene, as well as his grandchildren Edward Dean, Melissa Anne, Lindsay Marie, Ciel James, Julius Lee, Calvin Daniel and great grandson, Theodore Allen and many nieces and nephews.
