November 22, 1941 - January 17, 2018

Jimmy McCrimmon, 76, was born in Coleman, Florida, on November 22, 1941. He passed away on January 17, 2018. He is survived by his son Jason and daughters Paige and Shannon, grandchildren Dani, Brie, Shae, Emma, Jake, Brook, and Phoebe, and great-grandchildren Angella, Rhiley, and Brennan. Jimmy loved God, his family and his country above anything else. He served in the United States Marine Corps and worked for the Florida State Highway Patrol for more than twenty-five years, serving as both a trooper and a dispatcher. He was injured in the line of duty, overcoming a near tragic accident. Jimmy is well-known to have coined the term "Jimmy Riggin" after his successful use of vice grips as substitute shower handles. Other terms of note: BVDs ("You ever seen one of those BVD movies?") and Gia ("I like those cars"). His favorite actress was Maureen O'Hara, favorite singer was Dolly Parton, and one of his favorite songs was "O My Darlene, Clementine", which he could be heard loudly singing in the early morning. A true survivor, Jimmy lived his life to its fullest and saw each and every day as a blessing. He was a faithful Christian, remarkable man and a loving husband and father. His warm, infectious personality made all who knew him truly love him. He is dearly missed.
