



John Jairo Murillo "Chino"

March 17, 1969 - November 20, 2016

John Jairo Murillo, también conocido como Chino, murió en la madrugada del domingo 20 de noviembre en un accidente automovilístico a la temprana edad de 47 años.

John nació en Pereira, Colombia el 17 de marzo de 1969. Cuando John tenía 10 años, la familia se mudó a Jackson Heights en Nueva York. John paso parte de su niñez y sus años de adolescencia en Nueva York. En su Juventud John fue un excelente deportista y participó en varios deportes. El soñaba en convertirse en un jugador profesional de fútbol. Lamentablemente su carrera como deportista terminó después de una grave lesión en su pierna. John creció adoptando la cultura americana, desarrollando un gusto muy especial por la música de los 80s; como por Depeche Mode and U2. No fue hasta sus 20s cuando John abrazó sus raíces colombianas y descubrió el amor por bailar, escuchar salsa y la rumba colombiana. John se casó con su amor de colegio, mudándose a Miami para empezar su vida matrimonial. Después de un tiempo se divorció y se mudó a Orlando, donde él se volvió a casar cuando ya estaba en sus 40s.

John fue una persona callada, reservada y un ser humano muy bondadoso. Para aquellos que lo conocieron y lo quieren siempre lo recordaran como el alma de la fiesta. John adoraba tomar y bailar y siempre fue muy generoso con todas las personas que conocía. A John le encantaba reír, bromear y

pasársela muy bien. Fue una persona con sueños y ambiciones, muchos de los cuales quedaron troncados con su muerte prematura.

A John lo sobreviven su madre Elena, su esposa, sus hermanos mayores, su sobrina con su esposo, sus sobrinos; y una larga familia que incluye tíos, tías, primos y un montón de amigos tanto en los estados Unidos como en Colombia. La familia está muy triste al verlo partir tan pronto, sabiendo que él todavía tenía tantas cosas para hacer. John married his high school sweetheart, and moved to Miami to begin his married life. They were divorced and John moved to Orlando, where he later remarried in his early 40s.

John was a very quiet, reserved, and kind human being, however, his loved ones and friends will always remember him as the life of the party. John loved

to drink and dance and was always generous with anyone who made his acquaintance. John always loved to laugh, joke around, and have a good time. He was a person of goals and dreams, many of which were truncated due to his premature passing.

John is survived by his mother, Elena, his wife, his older sister and brother, his niece and her husband, his nephews and by his large extended family including numerous aunts, uncles, cousins, and friends both in the United States and Colombia. His family is saddened to see him go so early into his life, while he still had many ambitions left to accomplish. John will forever be remembered and carried in the hearts of all of his loved ones and friends.

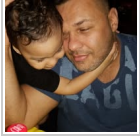
