Louis Jerome Wigfall was born February 12th, 1970 to Louis J. Wigfall (deceased) and Linda V. Kilpatrick. As a child, he attended Holy Cross School in Philadelphia and would later graduate from Cardinal Dougherty High School in 1988. Louis was a natural athlete and his standout sport was basketball which he played through high school and later with the Sheriff's Department. As the eldest of three boys, Louis took his job as a big brother very seriously. His experience guiding and keeping his brothers on a straight and narrow path laid the perfect groundwork for 2 things that would become his greatest passions in life; being a father and being in law enforcement.

After high school, Louis welcomed his first child, Louis Blake Wigfall, and was later married. He had achieved one of his greatest accomplishments to date, becoming a Dad! It was during this time period that Louis joined the Navy, taking his first steps towards his dream of earning a degree in Criminal Justice. In 2003, nearing the end of his service in the Navy, his 2nd son, Bryce Xavier Wigfall was born. At that point, fatherhood became Louis' main priority and he transitioned out of the military and into law enforcement to be closer to home.

Louis was known for his kind, generous nature and big heart! But more than that, everyone knew how much he loved his sons and how much he loved being a father.

On Monday, December 11, 2017 while pursuing a lifelong dream of becoming a Deputy Sheriff, Louis was promoted to his eternal home in Heaven. He leaves to carry on his legacy: two sons, Louis Blake and Bryce Xavier, his mother Linda V.
