Mary Ann McDermott passed from this world on August 20th in Winter Park, Florida at the age of 83. She was born May 5, 1931 in Ogden, Utah to Glen and Hannah Lenore Limb and spent most of her youth through high school years in Butte, Montana. It was in Butte where Mary Ann met her future husband William P. McDermott at age 11. They began dating when she was a sophomore in high school and later married on December 31, 1950 while Bill was on active duty in the Air Force. Mary Ann enjoyed the military style of life in the Air Force and accompanied Bill on all his assignments which included Malstrom Air Force Base (AFB), MT, Yakota AFB, Japan, Otis AFB, MA and McCoy AFB in Orlando, Florida. Bill and Mary Ann originally moved to Orlando in June of 1969 and continued to raise their family in the area after Bill's retirement from the Air Force in 1970. They maintained a close family friendship with Clay and Maxine Johnsen who were also members of the Air Force community. Mary Ann survived her husband Bill who passed away in 1979. Mary Ann later found employment with Orange County taking 911 calls in the 1980's and later worked for Harcourt Brace Jovanovich (HBJ) as a file clerk. Mary Ann also survived four of her five children; Margaret (Peggy) Heath, Daniel McDermott, Karen Soloven, William McDermott as well as her grandson David Martin. Mary Ann is survived by her daughter Patricia L. McDermott; her grandchildren Josh Soloven, Peter Soloven, Ryan McDermott, Jessica Hardwicke, Laura Hardwicke, Sean McDermott and Brittney Ramirez; and 8 great-grandchildren.
