Mac moved back to Orlando, where he practiced dentistry for 52 years until his retirement in 2017.

Mac was a collector of all things and an avid outdoorsman that enjoyed hunting, shooting, fishing, and golf. Other interests included running road races in Orlando, the Single Action Shooter's Society, men's bible study, weekly lunches with lifelong friends, and UGA football. He had an amazing personal fitness routine his entire life, a passion for cooking his favorite meals, and loved a good steak dinner at Linda's La Cantina or Christner's.

Mac loved and cared so much for his family. He also cared for so many through his many friendships and dental practice. He had a great sense of humor and loved laughing with his buddies. Mac was a loving husband, father, and grandfather and known by many as "Gun Dawg", "Jogger", and "Poppy".

Mac was predeceased by his parents, Alice and Mac Sr. and brothers, Billy and Whit. Survivors include his wife of 38 years, Marlene, daughters Adair Owen (David) and McCauley Braswell, son Trey (Robyn), and grandchildren Sydney, Reece, Carter, and Austin.

A memorial service and reception will be held on February 26th at 11am at First Presbyterian Church of Orlando located at 106 E Church St, Orlando 32801.
