“ Dear Nicky,
Nicholas and I worked together at Trustco Bank in Downtown Orlando. Our entire office would eat lunch together on Fridays. My favorite memories are the serious discussions we would have about beliefs, religion, education, opportunity and Big picture items. We had a running joke: Either Liz, Nick or myself were going to invent something that could be sold and make a million dollars. We would work at thinking up those ideas Saturday after Saturday. As an engineering graduate from UCF, his life was destined to be so much more. We were there for each other, feeling each other's struggles and supporting in whatever capacity we could. His family was his greatest love. He was always investigating, trying to figure out a way to improve the lives of the people he loved the most. I remember a trip to Dallas so Nicky could see the home of the Cowboys one year, and helping friends and family make major purchases like homes and cars. He learned as much as he could about money so he could share that information with family about making good credit choices. Nick was working with me the Saturday morning that I learned that my nephew had been killed in a car accident. We had been decorating the Christmas Tree in our office. (Always a big affair - and Nick was usually the one up on the ladder.) He called my husband to come down to be there and he, with my children, finished the tree. He was like that: He stepped up to ALWAYS do the right thing. He always strove to be the Man his Mom would want him to be. I am sure that he has been with her just now, just before he takes his place at the Pearly Gates, waiting on the day his loved ones will join him there. No more pain, no more struggles. His wings were fairly earned. Love to his family, and may the comfort of good memories find you soon.
