



Pamela Anne Bromley

October 11, 1940 - June 9, 2019

Pamela Anne (Fleck) Bromley, age 78, died peacefully surrounded by her six children, Sunday evening, June 9, 2019 at Cornerstone Hospice – Orlando Health Regional Medical Center. Pam was born October 11, 1940 in Jackson, Michigan daughter to the late Christian and Lorraine Fleck. Pam grew up in Jackson MI, graduated from St. Mary's Catholic High School. She married her high school sweetheart Phillip Eugene Bromley and they were married 51 years and shared six children. In the early 1970's they relocated to Pensacola, Florida where Pam earned her nursing degree and became Department Head Nurse - Emergency Room at Baptist Hospital. Once the children entered college, she and Phil relocated to Orlando Florida where she took her desire and passion for nursing to the next level in leading, educating, and mentoring nurses and paramedics. During her 18+ years in nursing Pam helped establish FENA and the GOENA (Greater Orlando) Chapter and was Past President (2X) of the Florida Emergency Nurses Association (FENA). In her spare time she pursued her other passion and hobby of scrapbooking. She opened her own scrapbooking store in Orlando so she could share her hobby, and love with others. In 2006 Pam and Phil retired to Mississippi to enjoy a slower pace of life together.
