



Paul Tracy Scarborough

October 26, 1961 - September 21, 2018

Paul Tracy Scarborough, born October 26, 1961, in Madison, Wisconsin, passed away peacefully on September 21, 2018, surrounded by his loving family. He was 56.

Survivors include his mother, Margaret Mary Scarborough (95), partner Thomas Kale, siblings and spouses: David and Teddi Scarborough; Peter and Denise Scarborough; Diane Ynosencio and Stephen Ross; Pamela and Rich Crotty; and Janice and Gary Gundersen. In 1966, Paul moved with his family to Merritt Island, FL, where he began painting at an early age. After graduating from The Art Institute of Ft. Lauderdale, FL, in 1983, he began a career as art director in an advertising agency. As he continued to paint, he won many awards for his watercolors in outdoor art festivals throughout the southeast.

After leaving advertising in 2005, he began a career as a builder-developer in Savannah, GA. When he returned to Orlando in 2009 to do property development, he began exhibiting his abstract acrylic works at FAVO. After a private showing at Valencia College, several of his pieces were acquired to be part of their permanent collection. He went on to become associated with the

Mennello Museum of American Art, first as an artist and then as a board member where he worked to create a platform for local artists until his untimely death.
