Peter A. Zeno "Tony", 70, passed away on July 10, 2020 at his home surrounded by family. Tony moved to Orlando, FL in 2005 to be close to his granddaughters after residing in Amsterdam, New York. A veteran of the Vietnam War, Tony served as a point man with the First Cavalry Air Mobile Division during his 1970-1971 tour.

Tony touched the lives of many with his laugh, kind heart, and overall joy he brought to any room he entered and he will forever be missed. The son of the late Anthony and Molly Mancini Zeno, Tony was born on June 4, 1950.
