As a military family we were preparing for a move to Virginia and we wanted Mark to go with us.

I spare you the details but soon the newly baptized Timothy (Gift of God) Jerome (patron of orphans) became a permanent member of this family.

Tim made friends wherever we lived from the Philippines to North Dakota to Orlando, Florida.

Just days prior to his death Tim left the family a lengthy note “thank you Mom and Pop for loving me and giving me a wonderful home and family. Remember to give my love to past, present and future family .“ This is the Tim
