December 17, 1970 - December 27, 2017

William Andrew Thomas Warren, known to those around him as Andy or Mayhem, passed away on December 27th 2017 at 3:44am in Orlando, Florida.

Born in 1970 in Louisville, Kentucky, to Bill and Gladys Warren, he spent the first 7 years of his life there. In December of 1978 he moved to Orlando, Florida where he spent most of his life. He graduated from Colonial High School in 1988.

Working at Home Depot in 1990, he met Jamie Lynne Tucker. After moving to Baltimore, Maryland in '91, they were married in August of '92 and moved back to Orlando in '93.

Everyone who knew Andy knew he was a husband and a father. He was never shy about telling people about his family. He leaves his legacy with his wife, Jamie, and three biological daughters, Amanda, Michaela and Shelby and his mother, Gladys. He was preceded in death by his grandparents Hughie and Thelma Miller and his dad Bill Warren.

Andy's family encompasses more than these five women. He has six adopted daughters that he loved and guided as his own. He has grandchildren who called him Poppy. He has an army of brothers that he stood with and defended until his last, and who will continue to be around to defend his. He chose a family that was closer and stronger than any blood bond could create.

Andy was always there for anyone who needed help, even those who didn't necessarily know they needed anything. He would happily give of himself, to help someone else in need. He lived by his own rules, and they were rules that everyone should consider adopting.

God, Others, Self

He always put himself last. God and others always came before what he wanted or needed. He instilled that into all his children

You will not grow up stupid and you will not go to hell.

Andy instilled a need for education in all of his children. Not only a traditional education, but a desire for learning. Whether it was street smarts or book smarts, he always encouraged them to figure it out and learn something new.

Andy insisted his daughters and family wouldn't go to hell. He showed them to the lord, and helped keep them on the path.

Do what you love.

Even if it wouldn't make you a fortune, even if it would just barely pay the bills. Go after your dreams, do something that makes you happy. Doing a job that pays the bills is not enough. It is not worth it to do something for a paycheck if it makes you miserable.

Smile More.

Once he heard this phrase he couldn't get enough. It was one of his last tattoos, on his neck. It was big and bold. He wanted to live life with a smile on his face, and he did, all while reminding others to do the same.

Last, but never least:

Don't Mess with the Duck.

While this rule was directed at Momma Duck (a warning to daughters with smart mouths, and strangers alike) and expressed exactly how much he loved and stood by his wife-it is a rule that is applicable to his life. No one messed with his family. He was always there to defend them, even if that defense was as simple as encouraging them to stick up for themselves.

Andy was a light to everyone who met him. He put smiles on faces, helped dissipate tears, and calm the most anxious nerves. We are all going to miss him, but we are all better for knowing him.

“ To the Warren family and extended family. I have been thinking of Andy all week and can't get him out of my head - a good thing, because I was remembering all the fun times AND serious talks we had over the many years I've known him. He was truly a MENTOR to me and to so many others in the area. I can't tell you the number of people that have stated "he taught me everything I know" and he did that knowing full well that they would take that knowledge and later become his own competition in the towing business - GO FIGURE - THAT IS ANDY!! He literally taught me everything I know about towing. If I had a question, which I still do even after 30 years of working with towing companies - Andy was my go to guy.

I would laugh at Deputies that would call me and ask "what's up with this Andy Warren character? (Andy would always tell them to call me if he had an issue with a deputy, lol) I said , well, all I can tell you is that if he is telling you something, you'd best listen because he is right. And if you try to force your hand and go against him, the agency will lose - so go with what he is telling you to do". He tried to educate those that would listen, but he had no tolerance for those that thought he was just a "tower", and treated him with indignation - their loss - because he was trying to help them. He knew the Florida State Statutes about towing by heart, as well as the repossession laws. SO MUCH KNOWLEDGE!!

But Andy was a true FRIEND and I could separate the two. If I had a complaint against his company, he always rectified it immediately even if he wasn't wrong! He would release vehicles to those unable to pay to get them back after being stolen if I called him and told him of the issues. They would try to make arrangements to pay him something each week, but he would never take it. In my entire career with the Sheriff's Office, I have never heard anyone say anything negative about him - I can't even say that about myself!

I have NEVER met a more dedicated HUSBAND, FATHER, FRIEND and man of FAITH. To hell with what HE was going through - he always helped others before himself. He adored his family. You

could feel the love every time he spoke of them, which was often. He truly admired his wife Jamie and stated so all the time. He was proud of ALL his children - his own and his adopted , which he always treated as his "OWN". He and Jamie have taken in so many kids over the years that I have no clue how many there were!

Andy had some health issues but he would never let you linger on talking about them - he was more concerned about YOU. I have had acute bronchitis for a few months and was not allowed to visit him in the hospital, which I hate. So all I have are my text and phone calls which I will treasure.

The world has lost a true Angel and Warrior. I thank he and Jaime for treating me as a true friend - it was very special to me. At their vow renewal ceremony earlier this year, they gave me a bracelet that had "sister" on it and I will treasure the thoughtfulness of both of them forever. <3
